### **Principal's Report**

#### PARENT TEACHER INTERVIEWS

All families should have received a note with details on how to book parent-teacher interviews. The interviews are scheduled for next week, March, 22 - 26.

**COVID** Safe Guidelines for Parent Teacher Interviews:

- Parents are asked to physically distance outside the school.
- Entry will be via Gate 5 for students in Years 2-6 and Gate 9 for students in Years K-1.
- Visitors must check in via the QR code at the gate as well as sign to acknowledge that they have read the Department of Education COVID-19 guidelines posted at the gate.
- Interviews are strictly time limited.
- Parents are asked not to congregate on the school site. Please arrive just before your interview and leave at its conclusion.

### SCHOOL ZONE OFFENCES WHAT ARE **YOU** RISKING?\*

On the corner of St Albans Road and Lambeth Road (to the right and to the left) there is a new yellow line on the road which indicates it is a clearway. Police have been fining people for parking in this clearway.

Please be courteous to our neighbours by not blocking driveways. Blacktown Council has clearly marked the road, as indicated in the photograph, showing the area

where parking is prohibited. If you park in this area you are actually blocking two driveways. Riverstone Police have been contacted and will be making extra patrols around the school during mornings and afternoons.

We have had an increasing number of students bring glass containers and bottles to school, this is very dangerous because if these are dropped they will smash. Please do not send glass containers or bottles to school.



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
