Principal's Report

NAIDOC WEEK

Next week is National NAIDOC Week. Celebrations are held across Australia in the first week of July each year (Sunday to Sunday), to celebrate and recognise the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples.

The NAIDOC Week theme for 2022 – Get Up! Stand Up! Show Up! – encourages all of us to champion and drive institutional, structural, and collaborative change while also acknowledging and celebrating those who, for generations, have driven positive change for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples and communities. As NAIDOC Week falls in the holidays, we will be celebrating a little differently this year. Over two days in Week 5 next term students will experience a full day delivered by Koomurri – Aboriginal Incursions. Activities will include: Smoking ceremony and welcome song and dance show, didgeridoo show and storytelling, artefacts, weaponry and bush survival, aboriginal face painting, Aboriginal song and dance, Aboriginal art (on canvas), boomerang throwing and a farewell concert with student and teacher participation.

The school and P&C have partnered to bring this to all students at no cost. The P&C has kindly donated \$6000 to support this activity.

DISCO

Another great P&C supported event was our school disco run over three sessions on the evening of Friday 24 June. The students had a fantastic evening.

583 tickets were sold (K-1 = 207, Years 2-3 = 149, Years 4-6 = 227) with a total amount raised of \$5040.

There was a great turn out of parent volunteers to help the evening run smoothly. Thanks to the P&C who funded the DJ (\$650) and purchased best dressed and lucky door prizes. 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
