SELECTIVE HIGH SCHOOL TEST - 2020

Applications for selective high school placement are considered mainly on the basis of the Selective High School Placement Test results and school assessment scores. The Selective High School Placement Test will be held on Thursday, 14 March 2019.

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 7 selective high school entry in 2020, you need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address). Detailed instructions on how to apply online will be available from mid-September 2018 at https:// education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-7. The application website opens at that link on 9, October 2018 and closes on 12, November 2018. You must apply before the closing date.

ROBOTICS WITH 3/4I



Lego WeDo is a hardware and software program for creating robots for people over six years old. You construct a robot model and program it to move and speak.

Today we created Milo the robot. There are six different robots to create and our group made three of them. To make the robots, you need special Lego and an iPad. Lights, sound and voices can be added.

ROAD SAFETY FACT SHEET

Penalties from 1 July 2015



This Fact Sheet provides an overview of some of the penalties that apply to illegal parking on all roads in School Zones

If you stop in a 'No Stopping' area - Fine from \$319 + 2 demerit points



You must not stop your vehicle on a length of road or in an area in which a No Stopping sign applies.

No Stopping includes when the vehicle is not moving but the engine is still running.

If you disobey a 'No Parking' sign - Fine from \$177 + 2 demerit points



You are allowed to stop your vehicle only to set down or pick up passengers, or goods.



Your vehicle must not stop for more than 2 minutes The driver must not be more than 3 metres from the vehicle.

If you stop on or near a 'Pedestrian Crossing' - Fine from \$425 + 2 demerit points

You must not stop or park your vehicle on or near a pedestrian crossing to drop people off or pick them up.

If you are Double Parked - Fine from \$319 + 2 demerit points

You must not stop your vehicle or park in the middle of the road to drop people off or pick them up. Always stop or park legally and safely at the edge of the road or in a parking area.

If you stop in a 'Bus Zone'

- Fine from \$319 + 2 demerit points



You must not stop or park your vehicle in a bus zone for any reason.



This includes when the vehicle is not moving but the engine is still running.

A 'Kiss & Ride' area is always within a 'No Parking' zone. The 'No Parking' rules apply to all 'Kiss & Ride' areas.

Fine from \$177 + 2 demerit points



2 min. stay

You are allowed to stop your vehicle only to set down or pick up passengers, or goods.

Your vehicle must not stop for more than 2 minutes The driver must not be more than 3 metres from the vehicle.

When you obey the parking rules, it makes it easier to see what pedestrians are doing.

If you disobey a 'No Parking' sign - Fine from \$177 + 2 demerit points



You are allowed to stop your vehicle only to set down or pick up passengers, or goods.



Your vehicle must not stop for more than 2 minutes. The driver must not be more than 3 metres from the vehicle.

Junction Road - Side of school office





CHICKENPOX - CONFIRMED CASE

There has been a confirmed case of Chickenpox within the school, please see symptoms below.

- Chickenpox begins with a sudden onset of slight fever, runny nose, feeling generally unwell and a skin rash.
- The rash usually begins as small lumps that turn into blisters and then scabs.
- The rash appears over three to four days. At any one time, the lesions of the rash vary in stages of development.
- Symptoms usually occur two weeks after exposure to the virus.
- Persons who are previously vaccinated can still get chickenpox. If chickenpox occurs in a vaccinated person it is usually mild and less contagious than in an unvaccinated person.
